You can turn to us about any form of discrimination. The employees are subject to statutory confidentiality, act independently and only with your consent.

We offer:

- a protected space to talk about what has been experienced
- obtaining statements and accompanying discussions to resolve conflicts
- search for possible solutions, local support offers and, if necessary, referral to specialized agencies
- public and anonymous reporting of cases of discrimination in Jena and raising awareness of the right to equal treatment

What is discrimination?

Discrimination means that people are disadvantaged, marginalized or harassed because of

- racist or ethnic attributions,
- their religion or worldview,
- their language,
- their age,
- a physical, mental or emotional impairment,
- their gender or
- their sexual identity.

Discrimination because of one or even more of these characteristics is forbidden and still occurs in all areas of life: at work, when shopping, in the disco, when looking for an apartment, when visiting authorities or in local public transport.

Who can turn to us?

The Anti-Discrimination Office is the contact point for everyone who feels discriminated against or wants to take action against a case of discrimination.
